ASSISTANT SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 2008/2009 was a season of consolidation for the Club and congratulations to all who showed continued enthusiasm for CDCC cricket throughout the year. We finished fourth in the Club Championship; won the Second Grade Premiership but were beaten in the semi final; First Grade finished eighth; Third Grade finished fifth and Fourth Grade finished seventh, while we made Round 2 of the SCG Country Cup, lost in the first Round of U/21s and only managed one completed match out of five rounds due to wet weather in the Denis Broad Cup. Also, for the first time we fielded a team in the C & S competition. Congratulations to all our captains- Steve Mace, Mark Convery, Andrew Standing, Chad Mansley, Deepak Shah, Jed Dickson, Aaron Payne and Jesse Major- and players; as well as committee members, curators and supporters who contributed to Season 2008/09.

Our Club was again successful in having many players chosen in various rep teams- both junior and senior. Congratulations to all those players- you represented our club with distinction. Dane Macourt was in the Senior Rep Team while players to represent the NDCA at U/21, U/19, U/17, U/16 and U/14 level this season included Jed Dickson, Chris Connors, Parth Shah, Jesse Major, Jarrod Hayes, Jonty Major, Daniel Arms, Ben Evans, Matt White and Lachlan Cairns. Jesse was a standout, vice captain of Newcastle U/17s and selected for NSW Country U/17s and NSW CHS while Jonty represented NSW Schools at the U/15 Australian titles. We look forward to following their progress in future seasons.

The Annual NDCA Presentation Night saw our Club receive some individual awards- well done to Jed Dickson for being the best fieldsman in First Grade and Jesse Major who was named the NDCA Junior Representative Cricketer of the Season. At our Presentation Night, Aaron Payne won the Kevin Oliver Trophy for Player of the Season, Aaron Payne and Jarrod Hayes the major bowling trophies, Dane Macourt and Chad Mansley the major batting trophies, Dane Macourt the wicketkeeping award, Seamus Kelly the Paul Trisley Trophy for the best Under 21 cricketer, Jesse Major the Mark Hall Trophy for the best U/17 cricketer and Steve Mace the Tim Towers Medal for Clubman of the season. Congratulations to all award winners.

This season our Club fielded 4 Grade sides of a Saturday afternoon as well as a team in the C&S competition for the first time. We also competed in the NSW Country Cup, U/21 Comp and the Denis Broad Lower Grade Comp. This was quite a lot of cricket days, with inclement weather affecting some competitions more than others. A big thankyou to all players who made themselves available every week - it makes it so much easier to select and fill teams. Entering a team in the C&S comp did help in increasing our player numbers and making it easier to cope when huge numbers of players were unavailable at different stages of the season due to the HSC, Schoolies, holidays, Rep cricket, injury, work etc. We were also able to field a number of Charlestown Junior cricketers to fill in and a big thankyou to those players for their assistance. We look forward to many of these players coming through the grades in the future.

Thanks to our curators- Martin Dunn and Neil Evans for their efforts at Kahibah Oval and Hunter Sports High. During this season a roller for Kahibah Oval was purchased with the assistance of a NSW Cricket grant, while lock-up synthetic wicket practice

facilities were constructed at Kahibah Oval. Upgrades of the centre wicket area at Kahibah are now underway with wickets being shifted off the soccer fields while plans are underway through the Ovals Board to extend the ground's storage facilities and construct a barbeque area. Continued fund-raising will continue to assist the club in updating the equipment and facilities being used at both grounds.

The Club again benefited from the support of sponsors - thankyou to Central Charlestown Leagues Club, the Mattara Hotel, Newcastle Weighing Services, and Trisleys. We also held various functions throughout the year such as our Season Launch, Bowls Day, Christmas Party, Presentation Night and Mark Hall Golf Day. These were reasonably well attended (but there can always be more) and great social occasions - what better way to spend a lunchtime or evening than having a drink or three, a feed and a chat to celebrate belonging to such a great club. The Raffles at the Mattara on a Thursday and Friday night are raising valuable funds but they could always do with even more support. Get along from 6pm to 7pm and support the club- you might even win a meat tray or some schooners in the schooner draw. Please continue to support our Sponsors and any function that the Club holds. They are there to benefit all Club Members and without them fees will inevitably rise. There are already plans in place for numerous social functions for next season but if anyone knows of any potential sponsors or ideas about fund-raising please contact the committee as every little bit helps.

At a Junior Development level we again hosted some 20/20 matches at Kahibah Oval between the local junior clubs. These brought in many spectators and we hope to continue these matches next season. They provide an opportunity for the young players to play matches on turf and to get to know our Club. An exciting development this Season was the establishment of a Charlestown Academy to develop the skills of young players in our area. This was a joint venture between our club and Charlestown Juniors where a number of senior players ran training sessions at Hunter Sports High. It has already proved successful in improving skills and providing a pathway from junior to senior cricket with Charlestown. Our thanks to Neil Evans and our players who assisted in implementing this great idea.

A sad moment for the club came in late 2008 with the passing of Mark Hall, Life Member, former long-serving First Grade captain and committee member, after a long illness. He will be greatly missed for his influence on our club and his huge contribution to its success both on and off the field over many years. He will be remembered forever in our club's award for the best Under 17 player during the season as it will now be known as the Mark Hall Trophy.

A big thankyou to all on the Committee this season - it has been an interesting time and your hard work is appreciated. We will start the next season in a solid financial position and we should look to continue to consolidate this as we improve facilities for all. Once again a huge thank you to all who have contributed to this season - players, members, sponsors, life members, patrons, supporters and families. It is important that everyone involved in our Club continues to support the Club - if you don't, the Club won't continue to be successful. There are many areas in which you can contribute, apart from playing the game - practice nets, training, covers, afternoon tea, raffles, attending the Mattara and Central after training and matches, canteen,

cleaning, mowing, attending functions, collecting monies, scoring, finding sponsors, organising fund-raisers, assisting with juniors- the list is endless.

We look forward to the upcoming season and to seeing the Black and Whites successful again on and off the field.

1st Grade Captain's Report

Season 2008/09 was again one of rebuilding after some heavy player losses including Steve Threadgold (retired) and Jarryd Forbes (Wallsend) of which formed a large part of our bowling attack. In addition James Crawley (Sydney) and Paul Ross (retired) were a loss to our batting line up. These losses again left vacancies for talented and inexperienced younger players to fill of which Parth Shah moved in to secure the new ball and performed extremely well and thoroughly deserved the opportunity after many years of persistence in 2nd grade. What a great advertisement for working hard/persisting and taking an opportunity when it arrives. Jesse Major made his debut and looked comfortable in the top grade at such a young age scoring his maiden first grade 50 and bowling soundly. I am aware of approaches from other clubs for Jesse and his brother Jonty's services next year. I sincerely hope that they both decide to stay and be a part of building a formidable team with the many younger players now developing and making their way into first grade. Seamus Kelly was another player to make his debut and performed wholeheartedly in really difficult conditions.

The final placing of 8th was probably the lowest finish for the last 20 years or so of which indicates the high standard of which is expected. Again I didn't feel we were that far from a top 4 finish, beating Stockton (one of the competition favourites) and close games against Belmont (eventual winners) and Hamilton Wickham (another competition favourite) of which we could have or should have easily won. We showed we can match it with the best sides. Unfortunately could have and should have don't win competitions and we also slipped up against teams, a more experienced Charlestown team will account for comfortably in coming years.

Player absentees was a disruption to the continuity of our side and in some cases players need to show a greater commitment to their team mates in order to achieve the successes of past years.

Moving forward there is a great foundation to achieve these successes however as mentioned a greater commitment on and off the field needs to be given. Younger talented players need to step up and play a leading role in our revival and the older more experienced players must show more leadership on the field from a statistical point of view, myself included.

Our batting let us down with Dane Macourt (317), myself (293), Jwalit Shah (292) and Martin Dunn (245) being the best, none of these constituting a good season!! Our batting must lead the way next season. Parth Shah led the way with the ball along with his brother Jwalit both taking 19 wickets @ 18.05 and 17.42 respectively. Ben Troke 15 @ 25.27, Chris Connors 13 @ 27.69 and Erik Croese 12 @ 30.92 providing the bulk of our wickets. Our attack did a commendable job given the absence of any real strike bowler (with no disrespect to the efforts of our attack). We were able to build up pressure for long periods in the way Charlestown sides know how to, however at times we lacked penetration and let sides sneak away from time to time.

Our Tom Locker campaign was affected by rain against Merewether when it appeared the game could have gone either way. Merewether progressed having been seeded higher.

A second round exit to Cardiff in the SCG Country Cup was a disappointing loss in a close contest. I must mention Jed Dickson's 102 against Terrigal in round one the first of many and one of only 2 for the season.

I feel my story has been a similar one to the last few seasons - one of player losses for various reasons/rebuilding and finishing outside the four by a loss or two in close games. If we are to achieve our aims we need to play to or above our perceived potential of which is considerable. We are able to achieve these goals with more self belief/commitment and discipline over the entirety of the coming season.

Congratulations to 2nd grade on their semi-final achievement. 3rd, 4th and 5th grade for their efforts throughout the year to achieve our high standards in the club championship.

Thanks again to Kath for her efforts in the score box and other areas around the Club. The Committee thank you for all of your efforts in a thankless job.

To the players I would like to thank you for all the hard work and support through a long season but I do ask for more effort to keep improving both individually and as a team if we are to climb to where we need and want to be. If we are to do the same things with the same effort with the same players we will have the same (8th) result. We can do better !!! as we enter an exciting time in the clubs development with the many talented young players emerging at which I find to be an exciting challenge ahead.
