A big thankyou to all our captains - Steve Mace, Daniel Frew, Greg Arms/Mark Convery/Glenn Howard, Andrew Standing/Craig Mitchell, Barry Johnston, Jed Dickson, Tim Pryor/Aaron Payne/Tom Griffith and Liam Wolfe; all players; as well as committee members, curators and supporters who contributed to Season 2009/10.

Our Club was again successful in having many players chosen in various rep teams-both junior and senior. Congratulations to all those players- you represented our club with distinction. Dane Macourt and Erik Croese were in the Senior Rep Team while players to represent the NDCA at U/21, U/19, U/17 and U/16 level this season included Jed Dickson, Chris Connors, James Rushford, Jarrod Hayes, Kyle Tonkins, Max Magann, Mitchell Morgan and Ben Evans. We look forward to following their progress in future seasons.

The Annual NDCA Presentation Night saw our Club receive one individual award- well done to Chris Connors for being the best U/21 Bowler in First Grade. At our Presentation Night, Mark Curran won the Kevin Oliver Trophy for Player of the Season, Mark Curran and Aaron Payne the major bowling trophies, Tom Griffith and Ian Martin the major batting trophies, Chris Mace the wicketkeeping award, Chris Connors the Paul Trisley Trophy for the best Under 21 cricketer, Max Magann the Mark Hall Trophy for the best U/17 cricketer and Martin Dunn the Black and White Workers award. The Tim Towers Medal for Clubman of the season was not awarded. Congratulations to all award winners.

This season our Club fielded 4 Grade sides of a Saturday afternoon as well as a team in the C&S competition. We also competed in the Tom Locker Cup, SCG Country Cup, U/21s, Denis Broad Lower Grade Cup and 20/20 competitions. This was quite a lot of cricket days, with inclement weather affecting some competitions more than others. A big thankyou to those players who made themselves available every week- it makes it so much easier to select and fill teams. Unfortunately, during the season there were many players unavailable for various reasons for matches on both Saturdays and Sundays. This made it extremely difficult to put teams on the park each week and to maintain consistency in team performance. Hours on the phone on Fridays and Saturdays trying to finalise teams was not enjoyable. However, we were also able to use a number of Charlestown Junior cricketers to fill in and a big thankyou to those players for their assistance. We look forward to many of these players coming through the grades in the future.

Thanks to our curators- Tom Anderson and Neil Evans for their efforts at Kahibah Oval and Hunter Sports High. The upgrade of the centre wicket area at Kahibah was completed with wickets being shifted off the soccer fields. The first match on the new square was played at the beginning of January 2010. Funding has also been obtained by the Ovals Board to extend the ground's storage facilities and construct a barbeque area. We look forward to these continuing improvements to Kahibah Oval.

Unfortunately, the Hunter Sports High grounds will be unavailable for use for the next twelve to eighteen months due to construction at the High School. Steps are already being taken to source a "home ground" for our lower grade teams for next season. Continued fund-raising will continue to assist the club in updating the equipment and facilities being used at our grounds.

The Club again benefited from the support of sponsors- thankyou to Central Charlestown Leagues Club, Newcastle Weighing Services, Trisleys, the Good Guys Warners Bay and Harvey's. We also held various functions throughout the year such as our Season Launch, Bowls Day, Christmas Party, Trivia Night and Presentation Night. These were great social occasions that were attended to various degrees i.e. numbers should have been greater. The Raffles at the Mattara Hotel on a Thursday and Friday night are continuing – they are our only income source in the off season and need more support. Get along from 6pm to 7pm and support the club- you might even win a meat tray. Please continue to support our Sponsors and any function that the Club holds. They are there to benefit all Club Members and without them the Club would struggle to survive. There are already plans in place for numerous social functions for next season but if anyone knows of any potential sponsors or ideas about fund-raising please contact the committee as every little bit helps.

At a Junior Development level, a huge positive for the Club has been the continuation of the Charlestown Academy to develop the skills of young players in our area. This joint venture between Charlestown Juniors and us has already proved successful in improving skills and providing a pathway from junior to senior cricket with Charlestown. These sessions have utilised both the turf and synthetic wicket practice facilities at Kahibah Oval. Our thanks go to Neil Evans and our players who assisted in implementing this great development program. A number of Charlestown Junior teams utilised the practice facilities at Kahibah this season and we hope to continue to strengthen this link between the senior and junior clubs.

A huge thankyou must go to David Brown who volunteered to take on the job of Club Coach this season. From the pre-season to the final match of the season his professionalism, enthusiasm and knowledge have been extremely beneficial to all players. We hope that his efforts can continue in future seasons and that all players take the opportunity to improve their cricket through his assistance.

A sad moment for the club came in June 2010 with the passing of Noel Howard, Life Member, former long-serving lower grade captain, committee member and curator extraordinaire. He will be greatly missed for his influence on our club and his huge contribution to its success both on and off the field over many years. He will be remembered forever in the name of the Shed - the Noel Howard Pavilion.

A big thankyou to all on the Committee this season- it has been an interesting time and your hard work is appreciated. The proposed rationalisation of the competition by the NDCA means that we must continue to maintain high levels of performance both on and off the field. Once again a huge thankyou to all who have contributed to this season - players, members, sponsors, life members, patrons, supporters and families. It is important that everyone involved in our Club continues to support the Club- if you don't, the Club won't continue to be successful. 1st Grade Captain's Report

The season past was an extremely successful one and in my view rates as potentially one of our best 1st grade efforts even though our playing roster didn't possess the star players many other clubs enjoyed and the rating that many other judges gave including Neil Goffet (*Newcastle Herald* journalist) who's prediction of 10th proved way off the mark.

Our season seemed to surprise many as we progressed but certainly there were no First grade players at Charlestown surprised by our success. The pre-season involved a lot of hard work with the gym sessions and beach runs. Our success was an extension of this hard work and the two closely related.

From an individual player point of view we had better player depth than in previous seasons of which applied pressure to the first choice teams. Three second grade batsmen finishing in the top 8 in the NDCA aggregates.

As previously indicated we don't have any stars (yet) and nobody had a superstar season but when needed somebody put their hand up and provided the match winning performance and during the season every member played their role.

We have again developed the atmosphere that is common among all the successful Charlestown teams I have been involved in and with a very young side that can enjoy success for many years but will also need to work very hard to realize its potential. Our season always hinges on a point or two of which can be pinpointed down to a single 10 minute period during the season. This season, we won that 10 minute period more often than not.

Our batting was not outstanding and at times vulnerable but when needed we withstood pressure and got the job done. Myself with Martin Dunn led the way with nobody really dominating and our batting has plenty of improvement left in this regard. We clearly need to make more hundreds and this should be a goal in coming seasons.

The bowling was again very solid without being too flash and we executed our plans extremely well. Anyone who chased runs against Charlestown had to earn every run.

I felt it was hard to split our attack with everyone playing their part when required. Chris Connors was our best pre-Christmas and Mark Curran post-Christmas. Payney, Path & Macca all performed consistently when required. Erik and Dis provided the spin with reliability on a weekly basis. Our attack is not life threatening, but one I would take over almost any other in the competition. I get the feeling our attack is very underrated and probably that's the way we would like it. Although next season we may have gained more respect of which will increase the level of competition from opposing sides.

We were beaten by the weather in the SCG Cup of which was disappointing not to have had the opportunity to progress in what is a great competition. Next season may be that opportunity to win the only competition that currently evades the Club.

The Tom Locker Cup was a great win against Uni and one that built a whole lot of confidence to the team moving forward. Rushy's dig was of exceptional quality and had a lot of tongues wagging in what was a match winning knock. If I can be a little harsh I'd maybe ask for three figures next time! This win certainly gave us the belief to knock over the glamour teams in final situations and was a big turning point after Uni convincingly beat us weeks before.

In the two day competition our semi-final win against Uni was set up with a great dig by Dunny and our best opening stand for many years. We however failed to capitalize on this

great start but finished with a competitive total on a slow outfield of which our attack just bowls so well on. Once we applied the blow torch I don't think Uni truly believed they could win, whereas we knew we were going to win. This took us to a final showdown with Cardiff. For all those disbelievers out there I did win the toss and elected to bat. We posted a competitive 229 but had the opportunity to really post a much big score (we were bowled out in 77 overs). I felt we had a total to apply a lot of pressure on Cardiff and we certainly did this taking Cardiff 100.2 overs until they passed our score 6 down. Anthony Hobson 127 no being a dig of great quality and patience (we should take note). We all felt had we got Hobbo out at any stage, the final was almost ours, but this didn't prove to be the case. Our performance in the field and our bowlers was almost faultless and one we should be proud of in what was one of the great finals for many years and one that we didn't need much to go our way to reverse the result. I was extremely proud of our team's performance not only in our final series but over the entire season and would like to thank all the players for their efforts and support during the season.

Congratulations to the lower grades on their successes during the season and with more talented juniors filtering into our lower grades next season the Club is in an excellent position to enjoy many years of success.

Thanks to Kath for all her help during the season in and out of the scoring box. Your help is much appreciated and largely unnoticed, but not by me.

Finally to Brownny for all the hard work and coming on board as coach. The Club is lucky to have an ex-player of your experience and commitment involved for nothing more than the enjoyment of helping the Club and I must say your involvement certainly lightened my workload considerably.

Season 2009/10 saw the introduction of new blood to the club including a couple of father/son combinations. This new blood probably cost us wins in several games, however, the experience will be invaluable in the coming seasons.

The team was shaped around a few 'old heads' along with new father/son combinations of Dave and Aiden Moore, Stefan and Alex Kardamis, Rod and Jackson Mace. These were joined by young players Sam Walker, Jono Sharpe and Geordie Oliver.

The Cricket Academy with Charlestown Juniors is working extremely well and congratulations to Stephen Mace, Martin Dunn and Dane Macourt for running this program. It continues to provide the club with high quality youngsters.

Congratulations to Dave Moore on winning batting aggregate (248) and batting average (24.80). Other notable contributions were from Josh Ford (180), Craig Mitchell (134) and Sam Walker (121). Sam is a promising opening batsman and was very solid at the top of the order.

The Bowling Aggregate (19) and Bowling Average (14.95) were won by Craig Mitchell. Other notable contributions were Dave Moore (16), Andrew Standing (13) and Alex Kardamis (10) wickets. Alex is a promising leg spinner and troubles all batsmen through out the year

We wish Vinnie Hoppe good luck in retirement. Vinnie has played for many many years with Charlestown and managed to take a wicket in his last game. Unfortunately for Vinnie it was a loss.

Congratulations to Stephen Mace and the first grade team. They performed well beyond everybody's expectations, or at least those outside the team.
