## ASSISTANT SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 2010/2011 was a season of consolidation for the Club. We were beaten in the Tom Locker Cup Final after finishing fifth in First Grade. We finished eighth in the Club Championship; Second Grade finished sixth; Third Grade finished ninth; Fourth Grade finished eleventh; Fifth Grade (C&S) were seventh, while we were defeated in Round 3 of the SCG Country Cup; were fourth in our pool of the U/21's and were third in our pool of the Denis Broad Cup. A big thank you to all our captains - Steve Mace, Jarryd Logan, Glenn Howard/Brett Winchester, David Moore, Adam Mason and Jed Dickson; all players; as well as committee members, curators and supporters who contributed to Season 2010/11.

Our Club was again successful in having many players chosen in various rep teams- both junior and senior. Congratulations to all those players- you represented our club with distinction. Chris Connors was in the Senior Rep Team while players to represent the NDCA at Konica Cup, U/21, U/17, U/16 and U/14 level this season included Chris, Jed Dickson (captain of the winning Colts team), Sam Logan, Max Magann, Daniel Arms, Ben Evans, Matt Bench and Isaac Wallace. Daniel and Ben were both part of the Newcastle U/16 side, with Greg Arms as coach, that won the NSW Country U/16 Bradman Cup before going on to defeat Bankstown in the U/16 State Challenge at the SCG. We look forward to following their progress in future seasons.

At our Presentation Night, the following trophies were awarded: the Kevin Oliver Trophy for Player of the Season, shared for the first time by Mark Curran and Mitch Morgan; the major bowling trophies- Frank Simpson (Aggregate) – Nathan Travis; John Stuart (Average) – Mitch Morgan and Steve Woolmer (Aggregate) – Nathan Travis; two batting trophies - Mark Curry (Aggregate), and Mattara Hotel (Average), both won by Steve Mace; the Hogan/Lancaster wicketkeeping award – Dane Macourt; the Paul Trisley Trophy for the best Under 21 cricketer – Jed Dickson; the Mark Hall Trophy for the best U/17 cricketer – Max Magann; the Black and White Workers award – Heather Arms; and the Tim Towers Medal for Clubman of the season to Steve Mace; along with our various grade awards. Congratulations to all award winners. Our Presentation Night also saw a special guest – former Australian, NSW and Charlestown player Anthony Stuart. It was fantastic to see Anthony there and doubly exciting due to his appointment two days earlier as the NSW coach for 2011/2012. Well done Scoob!

This season our Club fielded 4 Grade sides of a Saturday afternoon as well as a team in the C&S competition. We also competed in the Tom Locker Cup and 20/20 matches, which were part of the first grade competition; SCG Country Cup, U/21s and the Denis Broad Cup Lower Grade, which featured 20/20 matches for the first time. This was quite a lot of cricket days with surprisingly few days lost due to inclement weather. A big thank you to those players who made themselves available every week - it makes it so much easier to select and fill teams. Unfortunately, during the season there were many players unavailable for various reasons for matches on both Saturdays and Sundays. In some matches we even struggled to put eleven players on the park, while there were instances of players not even turning up or leaving early. This is unacceptable in a team sport and made it extremely difficult to maintain

consistency in team performance. A huge thank you to those players who filled in at very late notice.

Thanks to our curator Tom Anderson for his efforts at Kahibah Oval this season. The upgrade of the centre wicket area at Kahibah has proved a winner for the club with the NDCA holding semi-finals (U/21's and Thirds) and a final (Thirds) at the Oval. We were also able to play a pre-season trial at Kahibah – the earliest we have played on the ground for many years. The extension of Kahibah Oval's storage facilities and the construction of a barbeque area have started and we look forward to these continuing improvements to the ground.

Unfortunately, the Hunter Sports High grounds were unavailable for use for the entire season due to the construction of indoor facilities at the High School. This meant that our lower grade teams had to play 'away' with Walters Park and No. 5 and No. 6 Sportsgrounds our 'home' grounds. At this stage, it is still unclear about the availability of the Hunter Sports High grounds for Season 2011/12. Let's hope this issue is settled sooner rather than later. The Club has plans in place for updating the equipment and facilities being used at our grounds and these will not be possible without the continued support of all club members for any fundraising opportunities.

The Club again benefited from the support of sponsors- thank you to Central Charlestown Leagues Club, Newcastle Weighing Services, Trisleys, the Good Guys Warners Bay and Harvey's. We also held various functions throughout the year such as our Season Launch, Christmas Party, 20/20 Day, End of Season Function and Presentation Night. These were great social occasions that were attended to various degrees i.e. numbers could have been greater. The 20/20 Day was a great success with 3 matches played on the day – Charlestown Juniors U/12 v U/13, Denis Broad Cup and First Grade. It was great to see some of our former players, Life Members and families turn up to watch. The Club is looking to make these days bigger and better in seasons to come. This season also saw the re-introduction of the barbecue back at the Shed after each day's play – it's a great time to catch up on how each grade has performed and have a drink and a feed. The Raffles at the Mattara Hotel on a Thursday and Friday night are continuing – they are our only income source in the off season and definitely need more support. Get along from 6pm to 7pm and support the club - you might even win a meat tray. This season also saw a Major Raffle take place with the draw to be conducted at our Presentation Night tonight. Please continue to support our Sponsors and any function that the Club holds. They are there to benefit all Club Members and without them the Club would struggle to survive. There are already plans in place for numerous social functions for next season but if anyone knows of any potential sponsors or ideas about fund-raising please contact the committee as every little bit helps.

At a Junior Development level, a huge positive for the Club has been the continuation of the close links between Charlestown DCC and Charlestown Juniors. A number of 20/20 matches as well as an U/14 Junior match were hosted at Kahibah Oval, while many of the Junior teams utilised both the turf and synthetic wicket practice facilities. These ventures help the juniors familiarize themselves with our club's facilities and provide a pathway from junior to senior cricket with Charlestown. We hope to continue to strengthen this link between the senior and junior clubs.

A huge thank you must go to David Brown and Neil Evans who assisted with coaching this season. We are looking to further develop our coaching and training structures in future seasons and hope that all players take the opportunity to improve their cricket through attendance at training and participation in all activities.

A big thank you to all on the Committee this season- it has been an interesting time and your hard work is appreciated. The proposed rationalisation of the competition by the NDCA has been put on hold but we still must continue to maintain high levels of performance both on and off the field. Once again a huge thank you to all who have contributed to this season - players, members, sponsors, life members, patrons, supporters and families. It is important that everyone involved in our Club continues to support the Club - if you don't, the Club won't continue to be successful. There are many areas in which you can contribute, apart from playing the game- practice nets, training, covers, afternoon tea, raffles, coming back to the Shed after each day's play, cooking the barbecue, attending Central after training and matches, canteen, cleaning, mowing, attending functions, collecting monies, scoring, finding sponsors, organising fund-raisers, assisting with juniors- the list is endless.

We look forward to the upcoming season and to seeing the Black and Whites successful again on and off the field.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Captain's Report

The season 2010/11 saw 1<sup>st</sup> grade finish 5<sup>th</sup> in the main event narrowly missing the semi finals and beaten finalist in the Tom Locker Cup, the 20/20 being a disappointment result.

Looking back I guess most judges (from outside the team) would have been satisfied with this as a good result however, having tasted success the prior season (TCC winners and beaten finalists in the 2 day competition), I feel disappointed that we didn't progress to the final stages of the 2 day competition of which is clearly the benchmark and what you need to be participating in come March.

We know that once we are into the top 4 we play the type of cricket that makes us a tough team to beat in semi final cricket and having been so close to the top 4 makes it harder to digest. Our season over the last decade or so has always come down to a couple of games that we win or lose in a close contest, this season was no different. Often our season is decided over maybe 2 or 3 ten minute periods through-out the season. This again was the case which enforces the point that we need to be on our game for the full 180 over's, as a lapse in concentration can often be the difference between making the semi's or not. Our bowling was again solid without being spectacular. We were able to bowl for long periods and consistently build pressure with the exception of Hamilton Wickham, no team got away from us all season. The wickets were shared around fairly evenly amongst our top 5 bowlers:

Max Magann who came into the side this season playing 9 games and taking 15 wickets at 14.20 performed extremely well with the opportunity presented and should develop further in the coming season with more consistency and a bigger physical presence.

Our batting lacked consistency and at times appeared vulnerable. However we did post some good totals particularly in the 50 over format. If in coming seasons we are to be a force our batting needs to stand up and tough it out during the difficult periods. There was a serious lack of application from our batting order generally and the lack of centuries scored is evidence of this. We need to play more match winning innings and that is what centuries do and what good players are marked by. The batting order is maturing however we need to step up a notch and realise the potential that this batting group has.

Chris Connors scored his maiden 1<sup>st</sup> grade hundred in the SCG Cup and should be congratulated on what was an outstanding innings. Myself with 655 at 48.79 led the way with the bat and with Erik Croese the only other batsman to register a pass mark. Erik who showed the remaining batsman a thing or two about application and valuing his wicket, Erik was not out 7 times during the season.

Dan Arms made his debut and will be a much better player for the experience. I look forward to Dan forcing his way into the side on a more permanent basis with his and Max Magann's debut, at such a young age it is a real boost for the long term future of the Club.

The loss to City in the Tom Locker Cup final was very disappointing given the excellent work we did to force our way in at the last minute on quotient. Finals do not come around that often and the importance of playing and winning finals of any type should not be forgotten, as success always breeds success.

The SCG Cup loss to City was disappointing after a great win against Stockton. Chris Connor's century deserved a better result and this competition should remain as a high priority in the coming season given that the cup has not visited our trophy cabinet as yet.

In the 20/20 we were beaten in 2 games that we should never have lost and this eliminated any chance of a finals berth. 20/20 is a fast growing format and the points available crucial to our destiny in the 2 day competition. We need to learn to play this game efficiently as it appears to be here to stay ( $6 \times 2 = 12$ )

Todd Disney has indicated his wish to move down the grades, I wish him well if this is still his desire. Todd has been a loyal servant of the Club and still has a lot to offer. Hopefully we can see Todd in the top grade in the future.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank David Brown and Neil Evans for their time and effort as Club coaches. It is important to have these type of people involved and lucky to have both, as we are with our curator Tom Anderson who is consistently producing one of the best wickets in town which is a great attraction for players.

Thanks again to Kath for scoring and other duties during the year.

Finally our position of 8<sup>th</sup> in the Club Championship is one that we can all help improve on. Charlestown has a very proud and healthy history in this department and we all need to strive to achieve another flag which is the true benchmark for Club success. Good luck to everyone for the coming season.
